Before you start leafing through them let me draw your attention to some of the highlights that are particularly close to my heart:

### 1. Frida Kahlo – The Painter and Her Work (Special Edition € 29.80) (English Edition)

On the occasion of the forthcoming major Frida Kahlo exhibition (as of April at Martin Gropius Bau in Berlin, as of September at the Vienna Kunstforum) we are publishing Helga Prignitz-Poda's key monograph *Frida Kahlo – Die Malerin und ihr Werk* as a stitched-back special edition. Contrary to the date announced in our catalogue it will be on the shelves in February. That same month will see the publication of *Frida Kahlo – Ihre Photographien*. Frida's private photo collection from the Casa Azul is an arthistorical sensation acquainting us with an incredibly agile woman and her extraordinarily intense involvement in all aspects of the life of the society of her day.

### 2. Robert Mapplethorpe: *The Black Book* (€ 29.80) (English/German Edition)

In time for the major Robert Mapplethorpe retrospective at NRW Forum in Düsseldorf (as of February 2010) we are re-issuing his classic of erotic male photography, *The Black Book*. The subject of a debate on censorship in the mid-1980s, it is now one of the most important visual contributions to the discourse on beauty, sensuality and sexuality in photography.

# 3. Horst Lang: Als der Pott noch kochte... Das Ruhrgebiet in den 60er Jahren (€ 24.80) (The Ruhr Mining Area in the 1960s)

On the occasion Essen Ruhr.2010 – European Cultural Capital, Schirmer/Mosel is bringing out *Als der Pott noch kochte...* with photographs by Horst Lang. It is possibly the most incisive memory of the glory and horror of mining life back in its heyday in the 1960s. Taken by former Essen-based police photographer (1931-2001), the pictures are bound to affect everyone, be they people personally familiar with the then Ruhr region, members of a younger generation, or people who arrived in the area later.

### **4.** Romy – Die unveröffentlichten Bilder aus "Inferno" (€ 29.80) (Romy Schneider – The Unpublished "Inferno" Pictures)

The Romy Schneider book *Romy – Die unveröffentlichten Photos aus "Inferno*" is a veritable sensation from France. For the first time ever it presents images from the legendary movie "Inferno" Henri-Georges Clouzot shot in 1964 but never completed. We see Romy as a 25-year-old, when her beauty was at its prime, possibly the only time in her life when her radiance was free of any clichés. The documentary now running in French cinemas on the legendary failure of Clouzot's film project will come out on DVD to coincide with publication of the book.

### 5. Icons of Rock – Unvergessliche Rock-Photographien (€ 39.80) (Icons of Rock photography selected by Graham Nash)

In collaboration with Crosby, Stills & Nash musician-cum-photographer Graham Nash we present *Icons of Rock*, assembling the greatest Rock pictures of the most famous Rock taken by the best photographers. Annie Leibovitz, Anton Corbijn, and Dennis Hopper meet Mick Jagger, Janis Joplin, and Johnny Cash, to name just a few. The shots were taken on stage, backstage or in hotels, and are marvelous samples of the unique sound of music photography.

#### **6.** Thomas Struth – *The Monograph 1977—2010* (€ 49.80)

Thomas Struth is one of the best known and internationally most successful photo artists today. The new and extraordinarily lavish picture book is coming out to accompany a major Thomas Struth exhibition on tour in Zurich (as of June 2010), Düsseldorf, London and Porto.
